



Regular wargames in St Albans. Outing to Richard and Marion's S.F. Bookshop East Sheen. Outings to films — Alien, Star Wars, Close Encounters, Monty Pythons 'Life of Brian', Star Trek The Motion Picture, Premiere 'Empire Strikes Back'. Our shows — Zardoz, Barbarella, play — Solaris.

Year 1980-'81. Film outings — 2001 A Space Oddysey, Close Encounters (Special Edition), Airplane, Hawk the Slayer, Superman 2, Flash Gordon, Our film showings - Thunderbirds are go, Silent Running, Star Wars. Conventions attended — Novacon in Birmingham. Fandersoncon in Leeds, Our Conventions -Polycon '80 Shoestring-con 2 co-ordinated by Graham Connor (physics) and PSIFAcon Shoestring con 3 co-ordinated by Mark Bunce (computer science). Banquet - guest Derek Stokes of 'Dark they were but golden eved' bookshop (organised by Miles Harris). This year two of our members (J. Cowie and Anthony Heathcote) were on the committee of an external convention Beccon, Some 20 of our members attended this convention, room party by Miles Harris.
